## An EPA is a SENTINEL TASK

An EPA describes key, representative, regular work. Together, the EPAs guide a biopsy of the practice of EM.


"Resuscitate a critically injured patient." or "Teach and supervise trainees." #1

CanMEDS still defines a specialist in EM. Each EPA has multiple milestones (i.e. competencies) from multiple Roles. These milestones are the scaffolding that support and describe the EPA.
